

## Clothespin Snowflakes



Step 3: After glue has cured, remove any tape. Cut and place a cardboard circle on a protected flat surface. With the large ends touching to form a "+" shape. Place the large end of the remaining four pieces into the corners.

- Supplies you need: Wooden clothespins (8 per snowflake)
- UNICORN SPIT<sup>®</sup> in desired color
- E6000<sup>®</sup> Industrial Strength Adhesive
- Masking or Painter's tape
- Paintbrush
- One inch cardboard circle
- E6000<sup>®</sup> Spray Adhesive (optional)
- Sandpaper (optional)
- Glitter (optional)

Step 1: Disassemble eight clothespins by removing the springs. Set springs aside. Place the clothespin halves, flat side up, on a protected work surface. (Hint: Wax paper works great.)

Step 2: Apply a thin line of E6000 along the flat side of half of the clothespin pairs. Wait approximately ten seconds for the glue to set. Then join the flat sides of the like ends together to mirror each other. Line edges up as even as possible. If needed, secure halves together using tape while glue cures.



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Step 4: Apply E6000 to the head of the clothespin (that touches the cardboard) and where the clothespins touch each other. Use tape to secure in place.

Step 5: After the snowflake is completely cured, remove any tape. Use a paintbrush to apply a smooth coat of Unicorn SPiT to the entire snowflake. Be sure to get in the cracks and creases. Allow to dry approximately 30 minutes. Apply additional coats to achieve the desired coverage. Allow drying time between each coat. Trim any cardboard edges from the circle that might show in the front of the snowflake.



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## Decorating Options:

Option 1 – FOR A STAINED LOOK: Apply Unicorn SPiT as a stain by gently wiping away the stain with a damp cloth while still wet. Allow to dry and sand edges to give a distressed appearance.

Option 2 – FOR A SPARKLING LOOK: Place the snowflake on a protective surface and lightly coat with E6000 Spray Adhesive. Sprinkle glitter over the wet surface and shake off excess glitter. Repeat this process for additional alitter coverage. You can also decorate the snowflake with rhinestones, buttons or many other options using E6000. Allow to dry completely before proceeding to Step 6.





Step 6: To hang the snowflake, cut a 6 inch piece of jute or string. Thread it through one of the openings in the snowflake and knot the end.

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
